

Information for Families Regarding
THREE- AND FOUR-YEAR-OLD CHILDREN
Who May Need Special Education Services

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q: What is special education for 3 & 4 year olds?
- A: Special education is individualized services for young children who have been identified as having a disability and require specialized instruction to access their education (appropriate preschool activities). Special education is a service and not a place.
- Q: Who provides special education?
- A: Your local school district is required by state and federal law to provide special education services for any child aged 3 to 21 who qualifies.
- Q: How do I know if my child needs services?
- A: If you have concerns about your child's learning and development, you can contact your local school district's department of special services to request an evaluation.
- Q: Who is eligible for special education services?
- A: A child who is determined to have a disability or a delay in any developmental area(s) (e.g., thinking, social/behavioral/emotional, physical, language and communication) that impacts his/her educational performance and as a result requires specialized instruction to access and benefit from his/her education (appropriate preschool activities).

- Request an evaluation through your local school district if you have concerns about your child's progress in any developmental area(s) (e.g., thinking, social/behavioral/emotional, physical, language and communication).
